CURRENT NEIGHBOURHOOD PRIORITIES

Date Set: January 2012

Mablethorpe & Sutton-on-sea:

1. Criminal Damage & Arson to Beach Chalets.

Alford:

1. Speeding Vehicles on the A52 Between Huttoft and Mumby - 07:35 - 08:45 & 17:00 - 20:00hrs and on Back lane Blisby to Falesthorpe 08:15-09:15 and 15:15-16:15
2. Traffic management within Alford Town Centre.
3. Parking – School times at Huttoft Primary School.

YOU SAID – WE DID Action against set priorities

Mablethorpe & Sutton-on-sea:

1. On-going patrols remain top priority for Neighbourhood and Response Officers at Mablethorpe to try and deter further damage being caused to Beach Chalets along the seafront. Uniform and no-uniform patrols are being conducted at different times and dates.

Alford:

1. Neighbourhood and Response Officers are continuing to carry out speed checks at varied times and dates. Drivers exceeding the set speed limit have been dealt with. Over thirty Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued since October 2011.
2. PCSO's in Alford continue to monitor traffic within the Town Centre. Drivers who park illegally have been dealt with appropriately. Over, 20 Fixed Penalty Notices have been issued since October 2011.
3. PCSO's in Alford are working with Lincolnshire County Council to come up with ways to manage traffic at school times at Huttoft. Of late, there has been a major improvement.

G4S has been selected to deliver outsourcing services for Lincolnshire Police...



G4S, the UK's leading secure solutions provider, has been selected to deliver middle and back office functions for Lincolnshire Police – the first contract of its kind to be let by a British Police Authority.

G4S was selected from an original 160 bidders to deliver the Lincolnshire Police Business Transformation Project and from April 2012 will be providing a range of functions, formerly delivered by a combination of civilian employees and police officers.

The contract, worth at least £200million over the next ten years, represents the widest range of services ever offered in a single contract by a UK Police Authority, from HR to finance, and from custody services to fleet management. In total the Authority expects to make around £28m in savings over the life of the contract.

Neighbourhood & Response Staff Changes...

Police Constable Ranyard & Police Constable Dennis from Mablethorpe's Response Team have joined Lincolnshire Police's Roads Policing Unit and now work from Police Headquarters covering the county of Lincolnshire.

The Mablethorpe Response Team welcomes Police Constable Brailsford who previously worked within Skegness Criminal Investigation Department. Additionally, Police Constable Copley from Neighbourhood Policing in Mablethorpe will join the Response Team in April 2012.

Chief Constable Announces Intention to Retire...

Chief Constable Richard Crompton has announced his intention to retire. He joined Lincolnshire Police in August 2004 as Deputy Chief Constable with previous service in Cumbria and Devon and Cornwall Constabularies.

Mr Crompton has made his decision for both personal and professional reasons. Primarily however having led the force through great change, he believes it is now the right time to step aside and allow another to take up the reins.

In April the force commences a new contract with the strategic partner and the Chief Constable believes it is right that fresh leadership has the opportunity to shape and develop that crucial relationship.

Operation Blackwater...

Operation Blackwater was ran over the Festive period to deter driver from drink or drug driving. Highly visible and well-signed road checks have been in operation across the Mablethorpe and Alford area since 1st December 2011 until 1st January 2012. Checks have been carried out in early morning, evening and nighttime.

Lincolnshire Police feel that the profile of this campaign has reached drivers in Lincolnshire and shown it is not worth putting yourself and other road users at risk by drink or drug driving. There will be a number of drivers who made a positive decision not to drink or drug drive over the Festive period but we cannot measure how many made that decision. What we will do for the future is, with high profile campaigning and a robust strategy of enforcement, we ensure those drivers who drink or drug drive are placed before the Courts and make the roads of Lincolnshire safer for all.

Over the Festive period 143 drivers throughout Lincolnshire tested were identified to be driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol. In total 4394 were administered.

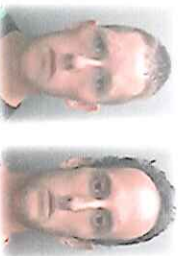
Two men arrested in Mablethorpe...

Two men from the Mablethorpe area have been given custodial sentences at Lincoln Crown Court for a high value burglary in Sutton-On-Sea last September.

Appearing at Lincoln Crown Court in December, James Simon Power (24), from Cawkwell Close, Sutton-On-Sea was sentenced to 4 years in prison and Nathan Mark O'Connor (28), from The Glade in Sandliands, Mablethorpe, received a 2-year sentence plus a compensation order.

The pair broke into a property in The Broadway, Sutton-On-Sea, during the evening of 8 September 2011 and stole over £50000 worth of cash and jewellery.

DC Gary Hugo, from Louth CID, said, "This was a high value burglary that caused great distress to the victim. Lincolnshire Police are committed to identifying those criminals who have such a negative impact on our communities and this sentence sends the message to others that they will be caught and punished for their offences."

Criminal Damage to Alford Church...

Alford Church experienced a spate of damage especially to the windows of late. FOUR male youths from the Alford area were identified as the perpetrators to the incident. The males aged between 10 and 15 years have been recorded onto Police systems and were made to pay for the damage. Neighbourhood Officers have upped patrols within the area to deter any more incidents of this nature.

Generator stolen from local high school...

John Spendliffe Technology College of late had their generator stolen. Neighbourhood and Response Officers acted upon this incident. The believed perpetrators to the incident have been arrested and released on Police Bail pending further enquiries. The Generator has since been recovered.

Anti-Social-Behaviour... Neighbourhood Policing crack down!

Anti-Social-Behaviour in Alford has risen of late. Neighbourhood & Response Officers have upped patrols to try and deter further incidents. FOUR male youths from the Alford area have been identified as the perpetrators. PCSO Phillips has given verbal warnings to the youths and it was agreed for them to write letters of apology to the victims of their behaviour.

High Visibility Patrols will remain a top priority for Alford Staff over to coming months.

Criminal Damage within the Mablethorpe Area...

Criminal Damage within the Admiralty Road area of Mablethorpe has increased over the previous two months. Neighbourhood & Response Officers have increased patrols in the area and are in the process of identifying the perpetrators.
